Happy Advent!

Churches across the globe find themselves with very serious challenges. I was at a funeral recently and a staff person at a church in our city told me about a meeting after church. What to



do about financial shortfalls as government supports over COVID have ended. This church would expect 120 people on a Sunday pre-March 2020. Now they see approximately 30-40 people in the pews. The upside, about 75 people are watching their services via livestream. Here at Bethany these challenges are ours too. But the effect is a little less severe. We typically saw 175 people on a Sunday (pre-COVID), now we find about 125 in the pews with an additional 150 devices connected to our service via livestream. I have been asked how we maintained our numbers (despite many deaths), how 20+ people joined us in 2020 and 2021. The phone tree is one reason. Emails, e-newsletters, confidence in our COVID protocols another. Barry's recorded services early in COVID, the quality of our livestream services (thank you Barry, Glen, Rob, Steve, and Penny), are other reasons. But I believe the biggest reason was this; we kept *the home-fires burning*. The lay-leadership and staff and key ministers of hospitality (largely under the radar) helped us stay connected. When it was safe to gather in-person again, we did. And most importantly, we wanted to!

Advent is a time of preparation, anticipation, leaning into the Spirit of Christmas and Epiphany. There are things we can't do in these times of caution, but many things we can, if we are creative and engaged with Advent's Spirit of Opportunity. Over the summer we had that Spirit embodied in our student-staff. In the fall we saw it in gatherings in two city parks, in our Hall, in the sanctuary with Ukulele "jam sessions", Shawn's silent movie night, many weddings and celebrations of life, meditation, faith studies, youth groups, Sunday School in the renovated gym, and in the winter there is Walk and Talk, Joy-Lunch, Men's Supper, UCW, engagement with ISANS (Bethany people linked up with new Canadians in conversation circles), Handbells, and lots of ongoing pastoral care with persons living with challenges. We are NOT standing/sitting still. We are actively searching for Advent's Spirit of Opportunity.
