Just like you do at home, the church must sort all its waste prior to its pickup. Our church uses special garbage containers (black, blue and green) located throughout the building and outdoors in the laneway.

Bethany must pay for its waste pick-up. Our contract is with GFL Environmental, a local company that provides sustainable environment solutions.

Our contract with GFL covers pick-up of regular garbage, green and blue bin items.

Last year Bethany spent \$3,450 for waste management.

This is just one of the many operating expenses that is included in the church's operating budget.


THINGS TO KNOW FROM THE UNITED CHURCH OF CANADA


FOSTER FAMILY

The Year of Living Biblically:

One Man's Humble Quest to Follow the Bible as Literally as Possible



There are many scholarly texts that attempt to wrestle with so-called. Biblical literalism. I have used many of these in faith studies over my thirty-year career as a United Church ordained minister. But these texts rarely connect to the real-life questions mainline church members have about whether the Bible can be, should be, taken literally.

Bestselling journalist (not a theologian or Biblical scholar) AJ Jacobs attempts to live the Bible literally, chronicling his experience in 12 monthly chapters. Critics enjoyed the book, which includes some humour in the situations that Jacobs creates. If you have ever wondered, "Is it possible to live the Bible literally?", now is your opportunity to learn for yourself and engage friends and family should the question emerges.
