In 2023, 60 campers were sponsored through this funding source. 30 campers were listed on a wait list and missed the opportunity. The actual cost of attending camp per week is \$850.00. Families can pay for this experience through a tiered process. Most common tier selected is \$450.00 and then it goes up from their \$550, \$600 or \$700. Today, we have a "CAMPING POT" out to collect loose change/cash to be directed to this fund supported by our Local Outreach Committee.
