# BULLETIN FROM THE BOARD OF MANAGERS

Bethany is a busy place and that means things may get broken or wear out.

It is important that routine maintenance takes place and items are repaired or replaced.

Routine maintenance projects are usually carried out by the caretaker and volunteers. Funding for this work comes from the operating budget.

The BOM may also hire contractors to carry out minor projects. In 2023, Bethany used contractors to undertake drywall repairs and painting of ceilings in various rooms and hallways throughout the facility.

This year will see the BOM engaging a contractor to install motion activated lighting for the hallway from the Ladies Parlour to the Joseph Howe entrance.

Bethany has many entrance points as was noted last month. We have two primary parking lots – 2669 Joseph Howe and 7171 Clinton. Monday to Friday, 6am-6pm, we rent out 62 parking spaces to our neighbours at IMP Group Ltd. Please refrain from parking in those designated spots in the 7171 Clinton lot through the week. There are 9 designated spaces and 2 accessible spaces for Bethany United Church staff, volunteers, and visitors use on this side of the complex, plus the 11 spaces and 2 accessible spaces in the 2669 Joseph Howe lot.

#### St. Andrew's Sunday Supper - March 24th, 2024




#### **FOSTER FAMILY**

The Year of Living Biblically:

One Man's Humble Quest to Follow the Bible as Literally as Possible



There are many scholarly texts that attempt to wrestle with so-called. Biblical literalism. I have used many of these in faith studies over my thirty-year career as a United Church ordained minister. But these texts rarely connect to the real-life questions mainline church members have about whether the Bible can be, should be, taken literally.

Bestselling journalist (not a theologian or Biblical scholar) AJ Jacobs attempts to live the Bible literally, chronicling his experience in 12 monthly chapters. Critics enjoyed the book, which includes some humour in the situations that Jacobs creates. If you have ever wondered, "Is it possible to live the Bible literally?", now is your opportunity to learn for yourself and engage friends and family should the question emerges.



Participants <u>do not</u> need to buy or have the book. A summary of each chapter will be provided.

He is also the Chair of the Convoy Cup Foundation, created in 2002 to honour contributions of the courageous veterans of Canadian, Norwegian and international navies, merchant navies, and air forces who made possible the convoys that literally kept the Allied war effort alive in Europe during WWII. This is a not-to-be-missed opportunity for fellowship and learning.
