And throughout it all there was/is...God, that ongoing comfort, discomfort, reassurance, guidance, and resting space that brings us all together (read John 14 - In my Father's house there are many rooms).

These are interesting times. But this is also a time of thanksgiving. I have had many a heartbreaking call with persons in hospital or palliative care, all of whom I was not permitted to visit. I know some of you have been frustrated by the lack of in-person visits, worship, community-time and events at the church. We appreciate your patience as we try to respect the health protocols put in place to protect lives. We also have a building that has been under renovation. Again, we all know how anxious some of you are to return and David's letter, included in this mailing, will lay out for you how that is going to happen. There has been a methodical, caring, faith-filled effort by staff, lay-leaders and the work crew here, all trying to be efficient, pastoral and health conscious. In addition I have tried to do my part, since March 15th I have sent out a daily email to anyone who has shared with us an email address. I have received many thoughtful replies. Thank you.

Thank you for your prayers, the resources you have shared by way of envelopes dropped off in the mail slot at the church, the PAR givings, and the words of encouragement. My goal has been to be a non-anxious presence, to respond immediately when you reach out to me, and to keep us connected. In these very strange times I am thankful for and to you. Happy Thanksgiving!
